

The name of our study is Relationship between journal sustainability and compliance with the principles of transparency and good practice in scholarly publishing.

We evaluated whether journal sustainability was related to compliance with the principles of transparency and good practice in scholarly publishing.



In order to minimize possible confounding factors, we chose all of the 45 peer-reviewed journals, which are hosted by the same platform (DergiPark) and published by the economics and administrative science schools in Turkey, as the study sample.


Publication status, number of issues, submissions, published articles per year, rejection rate, common volume or issue, use of submission system and indexing in important indices were compared with compliance to the 16 transparency principles.

"Website", "name of journal" and the "peer review process" were the most coherent principles. However, there were no information on "advertising" and "direct marketing", and the overall coherence to the "Publication Ethics" principle was only 21% with no information on "data sharing and reproducibility" in any of the journals.



It has been determined that two journals have terminated their publications during the study periot. Generally, half of the journals published 1 or 2 issues and the other half 3 or 4 issues peer year


Compliance with the transparency principles increased with the rise of the rejection rate and the number of published issues per year.

There was a direct correlation between getting indexed in important indices and the compliance to the transparency principles especially the recently indexed journals had a high compliance rate.

Regarding the duration of using DergiParksubmission system, compliance to the transparency principles gradually increased.

Fourthy of them were using DergiPark submission system.

Besides its use as quality criteria, the compliance to the transparency principles may also be related to journal sustainability.
